Lamar Orchestra Supply List

1. Instrument – (violin, viola, cello, bass) Sized correctly by a teacher or professional at a string shop. It is highly recommended that you start by renting an instrument from a string shop. Please do not buy an instrument from Walmart, Craigslist, or an online vendor. I recommend visiting local String Instrument vendors. There are also a limited number of instruments that can be rented based on financial need for \$25 per semester. Please ask Miss. Martell to rent a school instrument.**

2. Instrument Accessories -

- a. Violin/Viola <u>Shoulder rest</u>. Adjustable shoulder rest that is the appropriate size for the instrument.
- b. Cello/Bass Rockstop. Either a <u>rubber rockstop</u> or a <u>strap for cellos</u>.
- c. Everyone Rosin, (or Bass Rosin) and cleaning cloth
- 3. Black three ring binder 1"& 3 Binder Dividers labeled, Warmups, Music, and Handouts
- 4. Clip-On Chromatic Tuner— This clip on tuner is for classroom/home use and must affix to the instrument to be used for personal tuning. You can either purchase a tuner that clips directly to the bridge or scroll (ex. Snark SN or ST models, D'addario NS micro, Eclipse tuner, or similar), or a tuner that has a detachable pick-up clip (ex. Korg Tuner with Korg CM-200 contact microphone, or similar).
- 5. **Method Book** See below for the appropriate book for each class, this can be purchased in most music stores or online. Make sure it is the correct book for the specific instrument: violin, viola, cello, bass.
 - a. Beginning & Philharmonic Orchestra <u>Essential Elements for Strings Book 1</u> (orange on cover)
 - b. Symphony Orchestra Essential Elements for Strings Book 2 (Purple on cover)

^{**}Financial limitations should never be a reason that a student cannot participate in orchestra. If your financial situation limits you from obtaining any of the supplies or instruments, please reach out to your Orchestra Director. They will discreetly make sure that students are equipped with what they need to be successful including binders, method books, tuners, or instruments.

Calendar and Events

Please view the Calendar that is handed out separately

- Please mark in your calendars the events for your child's orchestra. Not every event on this calendar is for every student.
- Please let your orchestra teacher know if you have a schedule conflict that you know of now. Absences that have not been communicated by a parent will not be excused.

Sectionals

- Students in Beginner, Philharmonic, and Symphony Orchestra might be asked to attend a few sectionals or rehearsals prior to a performance. These times will be communicated in advance.
- If students have an illness, family emergency, or other reason that results in them being absent for that school day, their sectional absence will be excused.

Grading Policy

A student's grade will be earned through points awarded for the following categories of assignments:

Participation– To receive full credit, the student must:

- Bring all required materials every day
- Be on time to class
- Be attentive and participating appropriately (see behavior expectations)

Performance -All students are required to participate in the performances that pertain to their class as laid out in the performance calendar.

- Attendance is required. If there are conflicts, I need to know as soon as possible and the
 excuse needs to be approved by me. If there is an emergency email or call me as soon as
 possible.
- Excused absences include sickness, death in the family, family emergency, etc. Please check with your orchestra teacher if you might have an excusable absence.
- Unexcused absences include avoidable schedule conflicts (soccer game, piano lesson, transportation issues..etc). Please check in with your orchestra teacher if you have a scheduling issue.
- If there is an unexcused absence from the concert, the student will receive a 0 for that grade and it cannot be made up.
- If there is an excused absence from a concert, the student will have to complete a separate assignment to make up for the points missed.

Sectionals-

- Students in Beginner, Philharmonic, and Symphony Orchestra might be asked to attend a few sectionals prior to a performance.
- If students have an illness, family emergency, or other reason that results in them being absent for that school day, their sectional absence will be excused.

Assessment

 Assessment grades come from playing quizzes and tests, chair tests, and any written tests.

Assignments

• Students will have some written work to turn in for a grade either in person or through Blend.

Fees and Finances

Fair Share Fee - \$50

Every orchestra member is encouraged to pay a Fair Share Fee donation of \$50 per year to help with cost of supplies, orchestra shirts, food for events, music, miscellaneous instrument needs, and equipping students who have financial need. This suggested fee mitigates the need for extra fundraisers throughout the year or the selling of extra items. If you are financially unable to pay a fair share fee, your child can still participate like all other students. The Fair Share Fee can be paid by cash, check, or online at School Cash Online. Checks should be made out to Lamar Middle School.

Donations

You are welcome to donate as a kind of "no-hassle fundraiser". The donations will go into an account that gets spent only on the orchestra students and their needs. If your place of employment does match donations, we gladly accept those too and can provide anyone with a receipt of their donation for tax purposes.

Instrument Usage Fee - \$25

If your child is using a school instrument, we ask that you pay \$25 per semester for the yearly upkeep and repair of the instruments. Along with this fee, school instrument renters will sign a rental agreement that they will turn in before an instrument is loaned to them.

School Cash Online

For the Fair Share Fee, Trip Fees, and other fees you have the option to pay online via School Cash Online through AISD. You will be able to find this link on your Orchestra Blend Page.

Financial Need

Finances should never be a reason a student cannot participate in orchestra or any of the events or trips. If you know you will require financial assistance, please contact your orchestra teacher. There is always something we can do to help!

Practice Expectations

All Orchestra students are expected to practice their instrument at home every day. The following practice recommendations for each group:

Beginners – First Semester 10-20 minutes per day, 5 days per week. Second semester 15-30 minutes per day, 5 days per week.

Philharmonic and Symphony - 30+ minutes a day, 5 days per week.

A normal practice session should include the following

- Tuning open strings
- Warmup or method book exercises
- Scale practice
- Orchestra Music practice
- Private lesson or other music practice

Expectations and Discipline

Classroom Expectations

- Be on time and have all your materials everyday
- Be respectful of your director, other students, and any guests
- Keep the room clean and organized
- Do not play or talk while the director is speaking
- Be respectful of orchestra property and others' personal property
- Do your best and be productive at all times
- Have a positive attitude and be nice No bad vibes in the orchestra room

Rehearsal Expectations

- Have your music, pencil, and tuner
- Do not talk while anyone is playing
- Keep bags under your chair
- Do not play or talk while the director is speaking
- Listen to your director, section leaders, and other students
- Raise your hand if you have a question
- PRACTICE happens at home REHEARSAL happens here

If a student does not comply with any of the classroom, rehearsal, or school expectations, the following steps will be taken:

- 1.) Verbal Warning (up to 3)
- 2.) Lunch Detention & Communication with Parents
- 3.) 15 min ISS Timeout
- 4.) Full Period in ISS/timeout
- 5.) Referral/Meet with administrator. Any physical threats, aggression, or threatening language could result in an immediate referral to an AP
